On the 5th of May the Baltic Pride rally, specifically the March of equality, was banned by the Vilnius District Administrative Court. The Baltic Pride March should have taken place on the 8th of May 2010. LGBT Pride events are demonstrations against homophobia, discrimination and inequalities. The tradition is based on the Christopher Street event in 1969 at which LGBT people gathered to defend their rights for the first time.

To persecute people based on their sexual orientation is to violate their fundamental human rights. Banning LGBT Pride events deny people of their right to assembly, the right not to be discriminated against on the basis of sexual orientation and the right to actively promote diversity. We want to express our solidarity with LGBT people discriminated both in this way and in all parts of their everyday life.

ESU understands that the march will now go ahead. However this march will go ahead with a capped number of protesters. This is undemocratic. ESU and members unions should make it clear to the Lithuanian government that this is unacceptable.

ESU also promotes that protests, such as street marches, are a basic human democratic right.
